



## Eastlea Primary : Pupil premium – planned expenditure 2014-15

Budget income for pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium (107) is based on the latest figures available from data unit in January 2014 and the census in October 2014.

Pupil premium provides £1300 per eligible pupil, except for those designated as LAC/SGO where £1900 is provided. This means a total of **£141,500**.

Additional funding to support visits linked to Ofsted action plan in terms of broadening pupils awareness of cultural diversity in modern Britain and providing additional enrichment activities in terms of extra curriculum/non-curricular opportunities	£6000
Expert music tuition provided for classes in KS2 via tutors provided by the Northumberland Music Hub	£5810
Rewards and incentives to promote attendance, reading and maths based on the focus areas of the school improvement plan	£2500
Attendance admin clerk to monitor first day response to absence/poor punctuality	£1560

**Reading** 100% pupils made expected progress; 51.9% made accelerated progress from KS1

**Writing** 100% pupils made expected progress; 37% made accelerated progress from KS1

**Maths** 100% pupils made expected progress; 55.6% made accelerated progress from KS1
